AEC Diesel Engine course (Newlyn)	17 - 20 June

Safety Project for Cornwall – Clive Palfrey joins the SCT Team

Clive says: "My aim is to encourage fishermen to embrace all aspects of sea safety. I feel that, if a fisherman took an hour per month addressing safety of their vessel, this would decrease the chances of any accidents. We are here in an advisory capacity, to help not judge and offer a free service to all Cornish fishermen, from large company vessels to small inshore hand liners". There are 7 main topics that we will be working on:

1. Encourage fishermen to wear a life jacket.
2. Help with annual safety equipment check.
3. Advise on emergency drills.
4. Book fishermen on any required training courses.
5. Set fishermen up with risk assessment and online Safety Folder.
6. Grants for non mandatory safety equipment.
7. Health and well-being.

ILO 188 phase in period (from MGN 605)

Survey and inspection of fishing vessels - Phased in over three years

MCA is inspecting living and working conditions on vessels alongside the regular fishing vessel survey (i.e. at the next periodic or renewal survey that is due). However, fishing vessels operating at sea for more than three days which are over 24m in length or operating more than 200 miles from the UK or beyond the continental shelf will require a Work in Fishing Certificate by 30 November 2019. See MSN 1885 (F)

Fishermen's Work agreement (FWA) – In force from 31 December 2018

All fishermen (except for single handed owner operators) must have an ILO 188 compliant FWA. See MGN 583 (F)

Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs) – In force from 31 December 2018

The MCA require all fishermen to wear PFDs when working on deck unless they can demonstrate in a written risk assessment that other measures are in place which eliminate the risk of fishermen falling overboard. See MGN 588 (F)

Medical Certificates – Five-year phase in

All fishermen will need a medical certificate. There are "grandfather rights" for existing fishermen in certain circumstances. (See MIN 575 (F))
